

Introduction to

The Frank Fat Founder's Award



Named for the late Frank Fat (1904 – 1997), (the driving force that created the Chinese American Council of Sacramento in 1988), CACS past president Dr. Sonney Chong and the CACS Board established the Frank Fat Founder's Award in 1997. The intent of the Award is to acknowledge those leaders who had, for years, selflessly given of themselves and their time for the community.

The Frank Fat Founder's Award is the highest award given by CACS. Only one worthy individual is presented this award at the annual CACS Gold Mountain Celebration.

Candidates for the Frank Fat Founders Award must be a member/ organization of the Sacramento community in good standing and have qualities exemplifying the founding spirit of CACS, which include:

- Being a strong, positive role model for youth, demonstrating good citizenship and patriotism.
- Being a strong representative of the Asian Pacific Islander (API) community to the Greater Sacramento community.
- Display a pattern of unselfish behavior which place the well-being of the API community before personal feelings.
- Has performed outstanding service to the API community for an extended period of time.

Individuals nominated for the Frank Fat Founders Award must have demonstrated a high level of leadership, involvement, and commitment to the API community and its organizations and projects for an extended period of time; to have had extensive involvement with one or more of the following:

- Programs/projects preserving the culture and history of the APIs.
 - Advocate for civil right issues beneficial to the rights and well-being of APIs, both locally and abroad.
 - Humanitarian accomplishments benefiting the API Community.
 - Constructive activities that raise the awareness of the community toward APIs.

Frank Fat Founder's Award

Recipient for 2016



John Chiang was elected on Nov. 4, 2014, as California's 33rd State Treasurer. As the State's banker, he oversees trillions of dollars in transactions every year. One of his top priorities is to conduct the State's business in the most transparent manner possible.

Treasurer Chiang was first elected to the Board of Equalization in 1998 where he served two terms, including three years as chair. He began his career as a tax law specialist with the Internal Revenue Service and previously served as an attorney in the State Controller's Office.

He made transparency a top priority, believing that sharing information with taxpayers enables them to hold government officials accountable. In November 2015, he unveiled DebtWatch, a website that offers the public easy access to three decades of data related to

debt issued by State and local governments.

Prior to being elected Treasurer, John served from 2007 through 2014 as State Controller, during which time he:

During the Great Recession preserved cash to meet obligations to education and bond holders. His cash management decisions, which included delaying payments and issuing IOUs, were cited as instrumental in keeping the State's credit rating from plunging into junk status, saving taxpayers millions of dollars.

Worked to ensure the fiscal solvency of the State's pension plans, and was a leader in pension and corporate governance reform. He proposed a plan to address the unfunded liability of providing health and dental benefits for State retirees, and successfully sponsored legislation requiring all State pension systems to adopt disclosure policies regarding board members and placement agents. He has sponsored bills to curb pension-spiking, require placement agents to register as lobbyists, and require CalPERS and CalSTRS board members to file more campaign contribution disclosure reports.

John aggressively used his auditing authority to identify more than \$9 billion in taxpayer dollars that were denied, overpaid, subject to collection, or resulted in revenues, savings and cost avoidance. He ensured that \$3.1 billion in unclaimed property was returned to the rightful owners.

The son of immigrant parents, John graduated with honors from the University of South Florida with a degree in finance. He received his law degree from the Georgetown University Law Center.


















Community Service Award

Honoree for 2016



The Sacramento Asian Sports Foundation (SASF) is an organization designed to support the development of personal character, leadership and citizenship in youth and adults in our Sacramento community. We wish to advance and promote the Asian Pacific Islanders' ideals of family, heritage and culture to serve our youth and community. We wish to have the better understanding of others through sports and Asian Pacific Islander cultural programs. In doing so, we hope to enrich, educate

and develop our community and preserve our Asian Pacific Islander history.

SASF started with the dream of seven Sacramento community members from various basketball organizations to build a facility so our youth could have a place to play basketball. The vision grew to a larger quest to build a multi-use community/recreational facility to serve the needs and activities of the Asian Pacific Islander community. The facility would serve as a tribute to the past, while celebrating the present and future generations of the community.

Fundraising began in March 1994 through various events like Youth Basketball Tournaments, Asian Style Crab Feeds, golf tournaments and other volunteer based enterprises. We finally were able to break ground in 2006 and opened our doors to a beautiful 18,000 square foot facility in March 2007.

Since its 2007 opening, the facility has hosted sports, cultural and community events. Some of the programs established since opening include:

- * Strive for Strength A networking and empowerment of teenage girls to build their self confidence and self esteem by bringing successful women speakers to motivate and be role models for these young women.
- * Teens Create Dreams An annual showcase of local aspiring teenage talent in music and other entertainment artistry. Monies are donated to local charities.
- * SASF Summer League and Basic Hoops Summer basketball programs for youth ranging from kindergarten to high school.
- * Providing Resources for Education & Professionalism (PREP) A program bringing current successful undergraduate and graduate students to mentor and share their experiences to both aspiring high school and college students, in hopes of fulfilling those student attendees goals and aspirations.

SASF continues to thrive and succeed through the generosity of its donors and the tireless efforts of its volunteers. SASF looks to continue its mission of providing and supporting positive development, leadership and citizenship of the youth and adults throughout the Sacramento Community.












