

Honoree for 2017

2017 Hall of Fame Clarence Chu

larence Chu was born in Canton, China and grew up in Hong Kong. After finishing up his high school education, Clarence decided to come to the United States to pursue his college education. In 1970 he immigrated to the US and studied Business Administration at the University of San Francisco. In 1974 Clarence received his Bachelor's degree in Business Administration and received his Master degree 1985. From 1974 to 1977, Clarence worked as an office manager at an agency that provided health care services for senior citizens at their private homes in San Francisco. On the side he managed properties for his family in San Francisco area. In the summer of 1976 a real estate broker found property for sale in Locke and approached Clarence and his family. The property had 500 acres of farmland and interestingly enough also included the entire

historic Chinese town. He and his family purchased the Locke property in July of 1977. Clarence became the general manger and co-owner of the Locke property. The property included the historic town of Locke, however the buildings were not included. Under the Chinese Exclusion Act, the group of Chinese people who built this town in 1915, built on leased land. When Clarence's company took over as the town's landlord, the majority residents were elderly Chinese men and women who only spoke Chungshan dialect. Fortunately, Clarence who speaks fluent Cantonese, was able to communicate well with the people. He provided calm and comfort to all the residents and assured them that this sale will continue to honor the lease agreement and no one would be evicted. He gained their trust and friendship instantly and the town continued to thrive. Clarence later purchased several buildings in Locke and converted them into museums to preserve them. These buildings included the Chinese school, the Jan Ying Chinese Association, and the Dai Loy Gambling house. Today his vision is to allow visitors the opportunity to go inside the buildings, learn the history of the buildings, and capture the experience of what living in Locke was like during the old days. In 2008 he sold one building to the California State Park and recommended that they restore and turn it into a visitor museum center for the community. Today it is called the Boarding House Museum. Clarence worked together with the Sacramento County Housing and Redevelopment Agency throughout the years. In 2001, he spearheaded the effort to convince the County to successfully unify the land and building ownership in Locke. In January, 2005, the building owners in Locke were able to purchase the land and received their grant deeds. Since 2003, Clarence has served several terms as the Chairman for Locke Management Association and Locke Foundation. He is the current President of the Locke Water Works Company. CACS is proud to honor Mr. Clarence Chu with the 2017 Hall of Fame Award.

Vision:


The Center accomplishes this mission by providing quality educational, vocational, human services and health programs to these individuals.

The Center was founded in 1978 to assist Chinese immigrants in dealing with the challenges of immigration and cultural adaptation. Today, we strive to honor and preserve each person's culture of origin by expanding our programs to assist non-Chinese immigrants, refugees, and other disadvantaged groups. We work with families to assist them in overcoming the barriers they face in attaining self-sufficiency by serving more than 6,500 multicultural clients daily across 62 social service, employment training, and youth programs. These include expanded learning programs in 53 schools in partnership with Sacramento City Unified School District, Elk Grove Unified School District, Twin Rivers Unified School District and St. HOPE Public Schools.

We began our partnership with the Chinese American Council of Sacramento (CACS) in 2004 with Operation Santa. Through this program CACS has enriched the lives of over 1700 families during the holidays by providing toys, food and gift cards to them. The annual Care for Kids event sponsored by CACS Foundation donates school supplies, academic games and equipment to the Center's expanded learning programs. These valuable programs have brought joy to children and have built a sense of trust with the families we serve.
