The Chinese American Council of Sacramento (CACS) was established in 1987 under the leadership of restaurateur and Chinese American community leader, Frank Sai Fat.

Mr. Fat's original restaurant, "Frank Fats" located on L Street in downtown Sacramento became a gathering place for politicians and community leaders.

It was in this environment that the concept of an organization that could speak out on behalf of the Chinese American community for equal rights and social justice flourished.

In May 2016 the CACS Board of Directors applied to establish CACS Foundation with a 501(c)3 non-profit tax-exempt status and received approval in October 2018. Currently CACS consists of two separate organizations:

- The **Chinese American Council of Sacramento**, a 501(c)4 organization;
- The **CACS Foundation**, a 501(c)3 organization.

With this arrangement, CACS will be able to continue its advocacy role in the community as well as involved with cultural and educational programs, qualifying for charitable tax-exempt donations.

What can the **Chinese American Council of Sacramento** do for you?

- Encourage participation of Asian Americans in civic engagement.
- Promote equal opportunities for education and employment.
- Develop leadership skills and mentoring youths.
- Influence policy and decision makers to support the underserved.
